Art	<p>Students have been given access to a folder on Google Drive for their next project 'Everyday Inspiration' which they can work through in their sketchbooks at home. Individual class teachers will direct their own classes with tasks to complete following the lessons in the folder. DT	<p>Students are able to access a folder called "DT Y7 and Y8" on Google Drive. They can find this under the 'Shared With Me' tab, and have also been sent an email containing a link to the folder. The folder will contain a wide range of potential activities and tasks that students should feel free to choose from. These will be added to on an ongoing basis. Students should aim to complete one task per week. They have been asked to have a go at 'Design and Make a Bookmark' and / or 'Design and Make Your Own Beads'. Students should photograph their tasks and outcomes and email them to Miss Saxelby for feedback (hsaxelby@batleygirls.co.uk). PLEASE NOTE - Dependent on individual circumstances, students may require supervision from an adult whilst cooking and preparing food. English	<p>For English, Year 7 should all be (1) using myON to complete the projects set by their teachers. The projects can also be completed on Google Classroom so that each task is clear and images can be included alongside the writing. Teachers are available to help on Google Classroom or via email so that if any student doesn't know what to do, they can ask. The projects will change every two weeks and will have a range of creative, reading, research and writing tasks. (2) Students should also be reading or listening to books and then completing quizzes on them in Accelerated Reader. Mrs Roberts sends an email every Wednesday with interesting competitions or extra challenges for students to complete if they wish. A book review competition was launched on 17th June - students can enter to be in with a chance of winning an Amazon Kindle or an Amazon voucher. Competition entries need to be in by Friday 3rd July and students can check their email from KRoberts to see what they need to do.</p> <p>Important things to make sure students have done for English: accepted the invitation to Google Classroom and use it to receive support and updates from their teacher. Geography	<p>Students should have now completed their A-Z Africa fact-files and are beginning a new activity this half term. All students have been added to Google Classroom and should accept the invite from their class teachers. Once accepted, work will be sent on a weekly basis. The tasks will focus on the issues of sustainability and the important of conservation in Geography. The first few lessons will allow students to understand some of the key issues facing the planet, including plastic and air pollution, ocean health and the methods in place to attempt to reduce / prevent damage to the natural world. Students should complete the activities on a word document and re-attach to Google classroom once completed to be marked. The topic will culminate with students using their new knowledge of sustainability to design and potentially create a sustainable school environment.</p>

You can send your teacher comments about your work if you need help but please make sure that you have watched the video beforehand. All work must be recorded in your orange Hegarty exercise book or a notebook if you haven't got yours at home.</p> <p>Your tasks will be on topics you have learnt since September. You will be sent an end of year quiz, via Google forms, made up of two parts (three parts for 7G1 and 7B1) during the week starting Monday 29th June. It is really important to complete this. The previous two quizzes (emailed to all students on 14th May & 5th June) will remain open for any latecomers to this project and the final quiz will be sent out on 3rd July.
